

DEVELOPMENT OF AN EVALUATION FRAMEWORK FOR THE PREVENTION OF SGBV

ADVISORY COMMITTEE: NORMS FOR ENGAGEMENT

InterAction's initiative to facilitate the collaborative development of an [evaluation framework](#) for the prevention of SGBV is steered by an Advisory Committee comprised of a Steering Group and a Reference Group. The Steering Group, made up of 6 expert individuals, is the decision-making body and steers the overall development of the evaluation framework while the Reference Group, comprised of 15 organizations, provides technical input.

The Advisory Committee is committed to upholding and respecting the following norms throughout the duration of the project (2019-2021) and will therefore intentionally reflect on these norms when making decisions and providing strategic direction and technical input. InterAction and the Steering Group members are ultimately responsible for ensuring that engagement within the Advisory Committee and with a wider audience is in line with these norms.



Inclusive

Ensure we're engaging a diverse perspective



Focused

Avoid trying to be everything for everyone



Relevant

Ensure national-level voices are incorporated; ground ourselves with what is happening at the field level (not just in terms of organizations but also national actors)



Practical

Maintain an appropriate balance between academic rigor and practical application



Technical balance

Ensure both M&E expertise and SGBV technical expertise are brought to bear



Accessible

Utilize simple language from the outset to facilitate sharing amongst ourselves and broader networks
