



Results-Based Protection

Field mission to initiate comprehensive field support for NGOs in Northern Triangle

Terms of Reference

Location: Honduras

Travel Dates: December 2nd – 6th

Purpose:

This is a scoping mission to meet NGOs working in Honduras and the Northern Triangle, to understand protection priorities and to introduce InterAction's Results-based Protection work. In addition, InterAction will look at strategies the humanitarian community is using to identify and respond to protection risks, including coordination mechanisms and inter-sector collaboration for achieving collective outcomes.

Methodology:

Key questions:

- How are protection risks identified and how are strategies to respond developed and implemented? Is analysis carried out continuously? What are the current strengths and weaknesses of protection analysis efforts?
- What are the specific types of protection risks that interventions aim to address?
- Which sectors and disciplines are actors engaging with most in responding to protection risks?
- Which protection concerns most need collective strategies in order to effectively reduce risk? What are the greatest opportunities for collective strategies to address these issues?
- What are the barriers that NGOs face to work across sectors and disciplines to address protection concerns?
- How have existing collective initiatives contributed to the reduction of risk?
- What kind of support do NGOs want in order to strengthen protection outcomes?
- Are key actors aware of the [IASC Protection Policy](#)? Does the Policy serve as a useful tool to mobilize collective efforts?

Key Stakeholders:

- The primary focus of InterAction's visit will be international, national and local NGOs working on protection and humanitarian programs in Honduras and Guatemala
- Additional stakeholders to be consulted will include representatives from: the Protection Working Group, UN Agencies, development and peacebuilding agencies, and donor governments.

Main Activities:

- Consultations with NGOs and civil society
- Consultations with community members, if appropriate
- Consultations with other key stakeholders, including UN and donor agencies
- Identification of good practice of results-based protection for future documentation



- Identification of key considerations and recommendations for NGOs and the wider humanitarian community to help inform a strategic response to address protection concerns in Honduras and Guatemala, including areas that require further research and investigation.
